Using the practices and principles outlined in the Early Years Learning Framework and National Quality Standards we will scaffold children's learning through intentional and responsive teaching, critical reflection and spontaneous experiences creating a holistic approach embracing being, belonging and becoming. Our purpose built and designed environment will create opportunities for individual and group activities, indoor and outdoor experiences.

We believe physical activity, healthy eating and rest are vital for a child's optimum growth and development, and lay the foundation for a healthy active life. Our outdoor spaces offer both natural and built environments where children are encouraged to explore, take risks, accept challenge and build confidence as they learn and develop new skills.
